 The products supplied are out of date.
- The products are not suitable to use in a tropical location.
- The items are well worn and not suitable for reuse.
- The products are culturally inappropriate.
- Too many items in large suitcases that are difficult to get off the boat and through customs.

"Health is a state of complete physical, mental and social well-being and not merely the absence of disease or infirmity."

In this session we will explore how the health of individuals and communities is influenced by a combination of various factors. The well-being of people is shaped by their surroundings and conditions. Factors like residential location, environmental conditions, genetic makeup, income, educational attainment, and social connections with friends and family play a significant role in determining health outcomes. In contrast, commonly emphasized factors like the availability and utilization of healthcare services typically have a comparatively smaller impact.

1630 – 1730 Public Health Interventions: Defining the Major Strategies In this session we explore health protection, disease prevention and health promotion the three major modes for creating healthy communities.

The World Health Organization (WHO) regards immunization as the most efficient medical intervention available for preventing deaths and diminishing the prevalence of diseases in our communities. Globally, immunization programs avert approximately 2.5 million deaths annually. In this session we will explore immunisation as an important public health initiative, issues surrounding individual compliance and the rising issue of resistance to immunisation and distrust in the community.
