### DAY 1:

#### Jean-Michel Filippi:

Jean-Michel Filippi is a professor of Khmer studies at the Royal University of Phnom Penh. He holds a Ph.D. in linguistics and master's degrees in anthropology and mathematics.

He specialises in the description of the Khmer language and various minority languages of Cambodia and Southeast Asia. He is currently in charge of a UNESCO program about minority languages and cultures in Cambodia's Cardamom Mountains.

Jean-Michel has published several articles and books about these topics, mainly in French and Khmer, but also in English, including "Everyday Khmer" and the soon to be published "Preliminary Researches About Cambodian Minority Languages". Apart from linguistics, he has always had a great interest in Cambodian history and art.

His wealth of knowledge on Cambodia makes him a fascinating speaker on a diverse range of topics.



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Following the introduction by Jean-Michel Filippi, you will meet with a local Khmer PhD holder with over a decade of experience working in government schools. With years of experience in both primary and secondary education, as well as university level teaching, our guest speaker will provide valuable insight into the Khmer education system.

Paula and Helen will then take over to compare and contrast the changing roles of primary, secondary or tertiary teachers; student educator, workplace student teacher trainer, psychologist, family counselor, and maybe even school nurse. Let us unpack and explore the current 'teacher'.

### **Afternoon: 2pm to 5pm**

Visit a local university and meet with educators and students on the path to becoming teachers. Learn about the differences in required criteria for private and government teachers in Cambodia.

This evening as the sun descends head out on your own private boat into the Mekong River and enjoy the skyline of Phnom Penh as darkness falls.

### **Morning: 7am**

At 7am we board our bus for the journey to Sihanoukville, this will take approximately 3 hours. On the way we will visit a local NGO 'Let us Create Futures' – children's care and outreach program to hear about the importance of childhood education to the Khmer people.

On arrival to Sihanoukville, delegates will visit a local Khmer government school, meet the principals and staff, and tour the campus grounds and classrooms.

During lunch compare and contrast childhood education in Cambodia to Australia. Following this we will board the speed boat for a short journey to Saracen Bay, Koh Rong Samloem to the 4\* La Passion Resort

### **Day 5:**

### **Morning: 11am to 4pm**

After breakfast we will take a traditional Khmer long tail boat to the village of M'Pai Bei.

Here you will visit to local primary school. With few teachers and small buildings, you will see what education is like for the children of this small fishing community.

You will enjoy lunch at a nearby restaurant and enjoy snorkeling on the way back to Saracen bay.

### **Afternoon sessions:**

-Teacher Education over time. Let us look at the educational changes to the teacher training.

-Anaphylaxis's for teachers – Food allergies are among the worst types of allergic reactions. It is now uncommon NOT to have a student in your school/ tertiary institution with a food and/or bite (bee tick) allergy. Update your knowledge and skills about this frightening occurrence!

–Compare and contrast education from the Koh Rong Samloem school



**DAY 6:**

Today we make the short trip to Siem Reap, gateway to Angkor Wat, the world's largest religious monument and the heart and soul of Cambodia.

Following a short 40 minute flight, we will arrive at the iconic FCC Hotel, where you will have time to enjoy a casual swim in the tranquil surrounds before our evening cocktail party.

Enjoy tantalising cocktails and canapé's as we watch sunset over the river at our welcome to Siem Reap reception. Here you will learn about all this enchanting city has to offer.

This morning we will meet Dr. Stephen Louw, who has been a teacher in Southeast Asia since 1992. He has taught in Malaysia, Singapore, and Japan, and trained pre-service teachers in Thailand and Vietnam. He is now based in Siem Reap. Stephen will share some insights about life for expatriate living and working in the region

**Day 8:**

**ANGKOR SUNRISE & FULL DAY TEMPLE EXPLORATION**

Wake up early this morning to depart at 4:45 AM, to see the amazing sunrise at Angkor Wat, a bucket list item on any trip to Siem Reap, the pre-dawn view provides a different and tranquil feeling in the cool of the morning. We will return to your hotel in time for Breakfast.

We start today with a visit to Angkor Thom, the ancient royal city of the Khmer Empire with its centrepiece; the Bayon temple. Although it may look like a shapeless mass of stone, further scrutiny reveals towers with enigmatic faces of former King Jayavarman VII. Continue to the Terrace of the Elephants, which served as a platform from where the King could welcome back his victorious army and the Terrace of the Leper King, which holds perfect carvings winding along a narrow passageway that leads to the Baphuon complex.





Next head to the picturesque Ta Prohm. This temple is considered to be Angkor's most beautiful structure and is overgrown with fig trees, giving a haunting yet exotic atmosphere. The magnificent roots of the trees have merged over the centuries with the temple's huge stone blocks, emphasizing a 'forgotten city' feeling.

Enjoy Lunch at a local restaurant nearby Srah Srang lake before continuing to Angkor wat. In the afternoon, visit the most famous of all the temples on the Angkor plain: Angkor Wat. The temple complex covers 81 hectares and is comparable in size to the Imperial Palace in Beijing. Its distinctive five towers are emblazoned on the Cambodian flag and the 12th century masterpiece is considered by art historians to be the prime example of classical Khmer art and architecture.

Angkor Wat's five towers symbolize Meru's five peaks, the enclosed wall represents the mountains at the edge of the world and the surrounding moat symbolizes the ocean beyond.

#### Afternoon: Tonle Sap Floating village

This afternoon we'll take a drive to the Tonle Sap lake. Once we arrive,, we'll boat to one of the lake's floating village communities and gain an insight into how the villagers live and what local life is like.

We'll then continue the journey out onto the lake with a cold drink to watch as the sun descends before heading back to the hotel.
